Minister's Message

You will find below a survey form we hope you'll fill out and return to the church. It concerns the future of this newsletter. A month ago—after long threatening to do so—the post office started requiring us to post our bulk mailings in either Caldwell or Newark. This meant that Glen Ridge addresses will not receive the newsletter until the following week. This has long been a problem for people with zip codes other than 07028. However, now it's a problem for all of us.

We believe it is a good time to consider again the format, frequency, and content of our newsletter and website. For this reason we ask you to fill out a survey and let us have your opinion.

One possibility is to continue as we are presently. These could be sent bulk mail, first class at \$25 a year, or electronically. A second option is twice monthly via bulk mail, first class at \$10 a year or electronically. The third option is once a month, mailed first class at no extra cost with weekly e-news updates. A printed copy of the updates will be made available at the church.

Another topic on the survey is your opinion about what you value in the current newsletter. What suggestions do you have to improve it?

We are pleased that at least 50 more persons now receive the newsletter electronically since this new rule of the post office went into effect. Any changes to our newsletter format and frequency probably will not happen until the fall, so if you would like to be one of these on our electronic mailing list, please email barbara.duym@glenridgecong.org with your e-address.
