MINISTER'S MESSAGE

The first Sunday of Advent falls during Thanksgiving weekend. We will gather that afternoon to decorate the building for the season and for the Advent Workshop. This is a great program for the entire family, with arts and crafts for children and wreath making for the adults. If you have never been, join us at 3:00pm. The event concludes with a pot-luck supper and the singing of carols. Reservations are requested.

That same morning, Tom Mustachio is planning a service using the music of Taize. You already know some of the music: *Ubi Caritas* and *Lord, Remember Me*. Taize is a Protestant monastic community in France which has been very involved in worship renewal movements of the last generation. Music is, as Jill Simmons reminded us on the 15th, the way we are ushered through the gate of heaven. I hope you'll join us on the 29th for some great singing!

I begin a new Bible Study for adults on Nov. 22nd with my 9am Sunday class. We'll read and discuss the Gospel of Luke over the next three months. The Gospel for next year's lectionary is Luke, so this affords us the opportunity to learn about Luke's particular interpretations of the stories and teachings of Jesus. He is the only non-Jewish author in the entire Bible and also the writer of the Book of Acts. Many of the Christmas readings come from his Gospel, so it will be a great and timely study. Please join us. The 10am Wednesday class will be in Isaiah for several more weeks, but will also get to Luke afterwards.

The following prayer was in my morning prayer on Consecration Sunday. As we go through this week of Thanksgiving and the beginning of Advent, John Baillie's words inspire me and I hope you, too!

"Give to me, O God, this day a strong and vital sense that you are by my side. In multitude and solitude, in business and leisure, in my down sitting and my uprising, may I ever be aware of your accompanying presence. By your grace, O God, I will go nowhere this day where you cannot come, nor court any companionship that would rob me of yours.
